- The Community Led Plan Questionnaire responses are currently being analysed and the Parish Council will start to look at them in detail once the results have been published.
- East Cambs District Council (ECDC) recently undertook a community governance review for which Mepal Parish Council requested some boundary changes. We have now received confirmation that the 3 following areas will cease to be part of the parish of Sutton and shall become part of the parish of Mepal; (1) the fields on the right and left as you enter the village from the A142 which includes the site for the proposed development in the Local Plan. (2) the area of land currently called Lilibet Wood behind Meadow Way with the new boundary line being the A142 and (3) along Mepal Road towards Witcham to include the dwellings on the south side of the road. This is great news for the Parish as any Section106 monies from the new development can be used to the benefit of Mepal. We welcome residents of Mepal Road to the village.
- VACANCY - The Parish Council are looking for a new Parish Councillor. Anyone interested in finding out more about the role please contact the Parish Clerk.
- The previously postponed drainage line work on the recreation field is due to start in March/April 2019 weather permitting. It is hoped that two pitches will be ready for playing on in time for the football season 2019/20.
- The Parish Council have approved the grant payments to applicants from local community groups for the financial year 2019/20. They are pleased to support these groups.
- Please remember anyone can contact the Parish Council by email or phone if they need any information, have any queries or want to provide any feedback about anything the Parish Council is dealing with.
- The Parish Council have been working closely with Local Councillors and Anglian Water to improve the drainage issues in Mepal. An update was reported in October 2018. The Parish Council are pleased to hear that after some rain over the last few weeks no reports of sewerage flooding or surface water flooding have been reported.
- Remember to report any graffiti or fly tipping etc to the District Council.
