Mepal Makers

Mepal makers is a free community workshop in Mepal village for anyone wanting to upcycle, recycle, repair or make things. We run regular introductory classes for anyone wanting to use the workshop or learn a new skill. The classes are displayed on the Post Office notice board, and on the Mepal People and Mepal Makers facebook pages. October's classes include making bird boxes, glass ware, picture frames and training on our equipment.

Once you've filled in a membership form (on mepalmakers.co.uk, or collect from the workshop at 16 Bridge Road) and attended a short induction you can join any of the classes or just use the facilities – **7 days a week, 9am to 8pm – and all for free.**

Facilities include:

- Glass kiln
 - o For glassware, enamelling and silver/copper/bronze jewellery making
- Laser etcher/cutter (paper, fabric, wood, leather and slate)
- CNC machine (cuts wood, slate, plastics, soft metals)
- Extensive set of hand power tools (members can borrow tools too)
- Bench top tools (Chop saw, scroll saw, pillar drill, planer/thickenesser)
- MIG Welder
- Electronics lab (oscilloscope, signal generator, surface mount oven)
- Sewing machine
- and we hope to add a 3D printer next year





INTERESTING BLAST FROM THE PAST

Taken from Mepal Scrapbook 1897 to 1990 by Mike Petty (See Mike's website – www.mikepetty.org.uk for further notes)

11th October 1922

By the erection of a handsome stone memorial cross to perpetuate the memory of those belonging to the parish who fell in the Great War, Mepal has paid a worthy tribute. From this small village with a population of less than 100, twelve men gave their lives, and one woman. On no other roll in the Ely district has a woman's name appeared. Miss Nellie Waters was stationed at the army canteen at Thetford, Norfolk, and while there contracted pneumonia from which she died. Her sister served in canteens abroad for some considerable time and was demobilised at the end of the war.






Ely Community Speedwatch Scheme

Mepal Parish Council News in Brief

Meetings

The next Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday 9th November at 7pm at the Pavilion. Please keep an eye on the website for confirmation as meetings are currently subject to late cancellation due to ongoing Covid concerns and a need for Quorum with only 4 out of 7 counsellor posts filled.

Recreation Field

The new attenuation pond is keeping the field well drained, but we are having difficulty getting the grass to germinate along the lines. A third reseeding is being carried out W/C 11/10/2021 and we ask everyone to only use the perimeter of the field (i.e. the outside 3m around the field) until the middle of November to give the grass a chance to germinate. Please only allow your dogs to use the perimeter area, as per the current signs. We really want to facilitate the return of Mepal Sports Football Club as soon as possible (target date January) so need everyone to help and abide by the current rules.

Brangehill Drove & Lilibet Woods

The necessary clearance of the ditch between the drove and the houses running along in Meadow Way and Brick Lane to remove the fly-tipped litter and make sure the drainage ditch itself is clear of bramble overgrowth is scheduled to be carried out by contractors in the next month. The nature of the rubbish means that a registered waste company must be used.

Tree Survey

We are currently carrying out a tree survey of the trees under the ownership of the Parish Council to make sure that the proper maintenance is in place.



Hedges around Playpark off the Recreation Field

We have received a request to cut the hedges around the playpark much shorter (or remove them) however this is in conflict with other Mepal residents in relation to wildlife habitat preservation. We need to balance all views so have decided just to do the annual basic maintenance to tidy the hedge up and then will consult with the wider community in 2022 regarding any more substantial work.

Councillor Vacancies

We currently have 3 vacancies and will be considering any applications at the November Meeting. The Parish Council really want to publish a Neighbourhood Plan but would need the new Councillors to take this project on, we currently do not have the resource for new projects. We have two people who have unofficially suggested that they may be interested in working with the new councillors, but unfortunately without the new Councillors this project will stall.

Grant Process

The grant application window closes on 29th October. As a reminder, we will set aside a sum of money each year which can be applied for by local organisations for projects which will be of benefit to residents within the parish of Mepal. We will not be starting any construction works for the demountable flood barrier at Welney this year and will start this work next year.
